## **L. Summary of my Activities and Future Plans**

Until recently, I devoted my scholarly work to articulating and reformulating Critical Pedagogy in both its general aspects and its particular Israeli–Palestinian characteristics. Starting from a general conception of a reflective Critical Theory as developed in my *The Frankfurt School and the History of Pessimism* (1996), it was actualized in many articles and in books such as *Philosophy, Politics and Education in Israel* (1999) and *Destroying the Other's Collective Memory* (2003) where I offered a concept of Critical Theory that challenged the hegemonic critical discourse. My critique of Critical Theory at that time was founded on the later works of the Frankfurt School thinkers. At the same time I made an effort to support my critique by reconstructing neglected parts of the Critical Theory tradition, especially its pessimistic writings and its negative utopia. This effort was articulated in my *Critical Theory and Critical Pedagogy Today* (2005), and *Beyond the Modern-Post-Modern Struggle in Education* (2007) in English and *Toward Diasporic Education* (2004) in Hebrew. In this later book I began my effort to offer an original concept of education from the sources of Jewish theology. In *Critical Theory and Critical Pedagogy Today* I tried to rearticulate Critical Theory and my attempt was to show that its essence should become the impetus and the framework for a new critical language in education. In *Beyond the Modern-Post-Modern Struggle in Education* I tried to develop a broader concept of counter-education and offer an existential, philosophical, political and educational alternative. This alternative searched for a new path beyond the modern-postmodern struggle, yet it assumed that much of the critical tradition might and should be preserved and edified.

My present work goes further down these roots and paths toward a new philosophy of education. Early on, I attempted to interpret Critical Theory and "implement" it in the field of education, and at the next stage to rearticulate Critical Theory and Critical Pedagogy as a collective, dialogical alternative with the support of prominent figures in the field of Critical Pedagogy. As part of this attempt I have organized in the past ten years international critical workshops at Oslo (2002), Miami (2004), Madrid (2006) and Oxford (2006, 2007 and 2008). Those stages are presently being overtaken by my current attempt to go beyond the critical tradition and to articulate my Diasporic Philosophy and counter-education. This new stage of my work is clearly manifested in my two new books that are presently in press: *Diasporic Philosophy and Counter-Education* and *The Possibility/Impossibility of a New Critical Language in Education*. In these new books and in many

recently published articles my Diasporic Philosophy and the centrality of the New Anti-Semitism are presented as a framework and precondition for current counter-education.

In my present work I articulate the New Anti-Semitism as the meta-narrative of current progressive thinking and critical education. It is my aim to reflect on the fundamentals, the specifics and the practices of the attempt to destroy the essence of Western culture and its alleged Jewish impetus. My recent attempt is to understand the preconditions and the powers that maintain the hectic dullness of our historical moment and its anti-metaphysical drive, which I understand as the manifestation of the exile of the (humanist) killer of God and the quest to return "home" – to the post-modern pleasure machine and its New-Age reactions. It is an attempt to understand the reasons for the downfall of humanist education and the deconstruction of the Enlightenment project in the presence of mega-speed arenas, the deconstruction of the preconditions for transcendence, and facing the possibility (for the first time in human history) of total destruction of all life on earth. While the new historical moment has been addressed within and from diverse, conflictual and rich perspectives and intellectuals prisms, the questions on whose synthesis I focus are a new work plan, which I consider the gate for counter-education that will challenge the rationality of the dullness of our historical moment: a new beginning. This is where my present work and my Counter-Education (while naturally showing their continuities with my former work) are presently positioned. For me, Counter-Education is more than a fresh academic stage: it is the impetus of my present life and a multi-dimensional educational alternative to which I am committed to devote my life and my academic activities. The conference "The New Anti-Semitism – Educational Challenges" which I recently organized at the University of Haifa and my two new books are of course only a beginning in this direction.

### **Contribution to the Study and Edification of Higher Education**

My actual involvement in academic life and in the public debate and political struggle concerning the actuality and the future of Israeli Higher Education has always been connected to my philosophical deliberations concerning Higher Education. In this light I initiated the constitution of the Inter-Senate Committee for the Independence of Israeli universities, trying to defend the autonomy and well being of humanist-oriented universities in Israel since the year 2000. I am proud to attribute to this involvement and its fruits the partial success in avoiding the implementation of the MALTZ Committee

recommendations which were meant to totally reconstruct the structure, the function and the aim of Israeli Higher Education. My involvement was central during the last nine years, including negotiations with the Minister of Education, presenting my views before the Knesset Education Committee, organizing a conference; giving voice in the media to the importance of defending a humanistic-oriented universities; publishing a book on the matter; and during the last strike writing a position paper which served as the theoretical framework for the leaders of the struggle (a paper that was presented also to the Shochat Committee). My active involvement set the background for my participation in an international contest run by the university of Cambridge and my nomination as a member in an international working group in Cambridge (as a visiting fellow January to March 2010) to address the issue of the conflicting possible futures of universities. I firmly believe that an orderly critical research of current trends in the development of Higher Education and actual involvement in paving its future are of vital importance. And I hope my Cambridge research will enhance and enrich my future involvement in the ongoing struggle on the future of Israeli universities.
